REPORT

On January 30, 2024, Reena Rohidas and Kanchan Baravia, students of the history department, presented a paper on "The Global Impact of the French Revolution" at the departmental seminar. Their presentation highlighted the far-reaching effects of the French Revolution, which began in 1789, on both Europe and the wider world.
